RESEARCH INTERESTS:

Over several school years beginning in 1995, created a pilot group counseling program called TeeNet. The fiber optic based Iowa Communications Network(ICN) was the communication medium for TeeNet. This project linked distant groups of adolescents in real time interactive (audio/video) conversations with the goal of improved functioning. TeeNet began as a private venture, and in 1997 it was funded under a research grant by the FINE Foundation as a part of the Star Schools Program.

The research from this study statistically demonstrated that fiber optic, distance-based counseling, was as successful as traditional, local face-to-face group sessions. This work

was recognized by the FINE Foundation as the top technological research project in Iowa for 1997.

While at the Decatur County Hospital a telecommunications grant was written through the U.S. Department of Agriculture, one that put an Iowa Communications Network studio in the hospital. This grant was for a total of \$245,000.00 and linked several schools and hospitals in southern Iowa with multiple schools in northern Missouri. It was ranked number three in the nation for that year.

A statewide program related to violence in schools, called Alliances Against Violence, was completed as a part of the TeeNet series. Thomas Vilsack, then Iowa Governor, opened the first session in September of that year.

A year after 911, the TeeNet model was used to link four schools in Henry County in a teen discussion that circled the planet. The towns of Mt. Pleasant, New London, Wayland, and Winfield joined for an hour conference with foreign students in London, England, the American School of Dubai [United Arab Emirants], and Tokyo, Japan. The actual date was October 12, and the students called it "A peaceful 1012 response to 911."

As a part of a tenth anniversary celebration, the administration of the Iowa Communication Network(ICN) awarded this project one of their "All Time Top Ten" uses of the ICN, that for in the fall of 2003.

PERSONAL;
